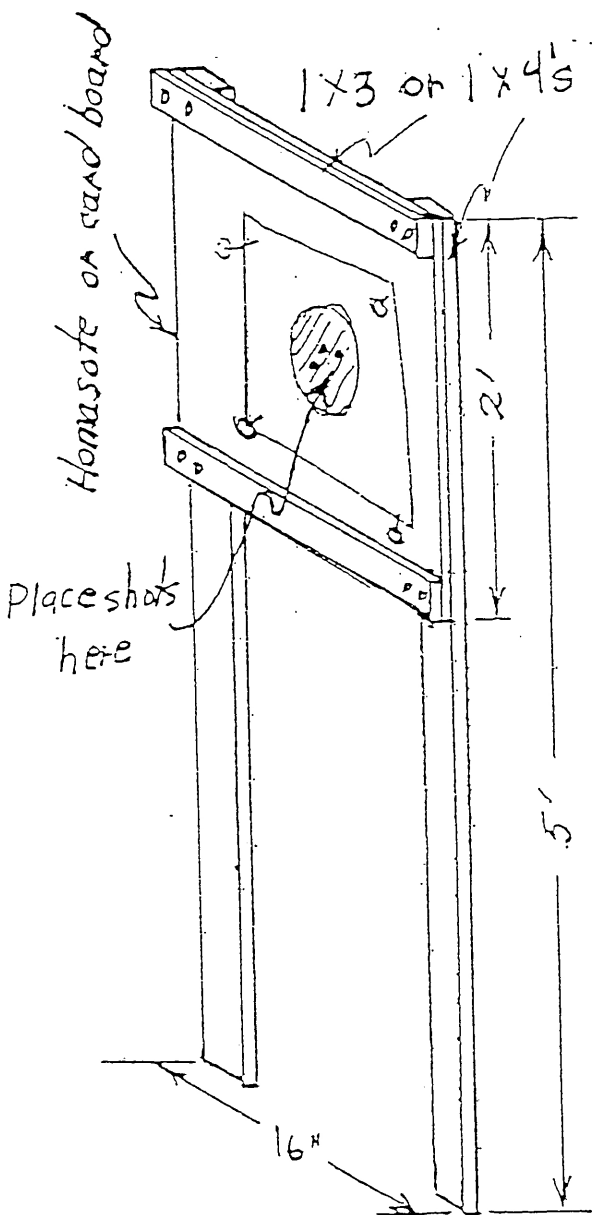

MURRYSVILLE M-1 TARGET FRAME

We have gotten requests for a sketch of a target frame, so here is a reprint of the one circulated a few years ago. A frame of these general dimensions placed in the target racks will help ensure all bullets fired through the target will land in the backstop. It will be noted that the target racks are the only acceptable place for the target frame. If you are not hitting the target from the firing line, you should walk to the target until you can. (PROVIDED that no one else is shooting at the time) Under no circumstances should the target be brought back towards the firing line! Our ranges were carved out of solid shale and, despite the thin layer of grass and soil, constitute a hard, flat surface which can easily cause ricochets. ALL Bullets must hit the bank behind the target racks.

We owe our neighbors, some of whom are club members, safety and consideration on this point. With just a little responsibility and common sense while shooting, we can ensure the continued existence of the club.

The target racks are built to accept a standard 1" board, so any 1" lumber will be fine for the legs of the target frame. A homasote or cardboard face will readily accept thumbtacks or staples. With the trend towards smaller cars, several members have built folding legs on their frames.
